

Student Book Awards... 2018-2019

The Greater Mondawmin Coordinating Council, Inc. (GMCC) has established the GMCC Book Award Program. Application can be accessed from www.greatermondawmin.org web page.

Application deadline: June 8, 2018. The following must be an attachment to the submitted application:

- 300 maximum word essay describing your community service experience as part of your high school curriculum to GMCC.
- college letter of acceptance/admission

Under the program, text book stipends will be awarded to Students who are residents of the Greater Mondawmin Community neighborhoods and enrolled to attend Baltimore City Community College as part-time or full-time student entering their freshman, sophomore, junior or senior year of study.

GMCC established eligibility criteria for the program as follows:

- Prospective awardees must reside in the Greater Mondawmin community for at least 1 year prior to the semester of the award. Evidence of the residency criteria will be detailed on the application. Applicant must live within the Greater Mondawmin community boundaries of: New Auchentoroly Terrace Assoc., Fulton Heights Community Assoc., Liberty Square Community Org., Mondawmin Neighborhood Improvement Assoc., Panway Neighborhood Improvement Assoc., Parkway Community, Whittier-Monroe Neighborhood Assoc. and Robert W. Coleman Community Org.
- Prospective awardees must be a graduate of Baltimore City Public Schools and must have at least a 2.0 GPA to qualify for the stipend. GMCC will coordinate with the Institutions to verify this information.
- Prospective awardees may be part-time or full time students for the semester in which the award is made, and will be required to show proof of enrollment.
- Funds can only be used for text books.

Stipends will be one-time awards and non-renewable. Awardees will not be eligible for automatic multiple consecutive semester awards.

Prospective awardees will be required to provide a minimum of 4 hours of community service to the Greater Mondawmin Community within 6 months of acceptance of the stipend.

An independent selection committee will review all submissions and based on the availability of funds, stipends will be given to qualified students who meet eligibility criteria. It is GMCC expectation that this program will be ongoing.

Once you enter the Student Center, take the elevator to the 2nd floor. The Ballroom will be to your left.


