Greetings to all and prayers to the family members of Congressman Elijah Cummings from the Greater Mondawmin Community. The area in which he so gladly and faithfully served. He was known to many of us as Congressman Cummings who was born and raised in Baltimore, the City in which he served us as a political figure from 1996 to his death, October 2019. If you've ever heard him tell the story of his early years he would always mention how he was born to sharecropper parents. His message would bring chills and tears to your eyes. He graduated from Baltimore City College. Congressman Cummings was an avid fighter in his early years in support of integration. *"Elijah Eugene Cummings was an American politician and civil rights advocate who served in the United States House of Representatives for Maryland's 7th congressional district. The district includes just over half of the city of Baltimore, most of the majority-black precincts of Baltimore County, as well as most of Howard County. He previously served in the Maryland House of Delegates. He was a member of the Democratic Party. "His work will never be forgotten."*



Neighborhood Improvement Grant Funds Available Through Coppin Heights CDC

The Maryland Department of Housing and Community Development awarded the CDC and its partner organization Neighborhood Housing Services of Baltimore \$300,000 through its Baltimore Neighborhood Initiative (BRNI) program. Coppin Heights CDC Mission and Objectives

Our mission is to be a catalyst for suitable and affordable housing for low to moderate income residents and to stimulate economic development within neighborhoods immediately adjacent to Coppin State University through the establishment of social, economic, educational and affordable housing development initiatives that collectively increase the stability and sustainability of our community. Our objectives are: (1) to raise the socio-economic and educational levels of community residents, (2) to expand economic development opportunities for community residents, and (3) to develop safe, decent, and affordable housing. To accomplish our mission, CHCDC seeks to bring together human and financial resources that build on our community's strengths to build physical, social, and human capital. CHCDC works in collaboration with community residents and other stakeholders to develop initiatives to support its resident-determined priorities: (1) Slum and blight removal, (2) Community safety, and (3) Elimination of known health and educational disparities.

Our commitment is to advance economic development in an equitable manner. We are committed to attracting investment to the neighborhood and ensuring equitable development that benefits long time and new residents. We are currently supporting two large scale real estate development projects totaling over 35 million dollars in investment. This work will provide affordable housing, expand commercial opportunities and bring critical healthcare services to the neighborhood.

The Coppin Heights Community Development Corporation (CHCDC) is a 501 (c) (3) not-for-profit organization established in 1995 by Coppin State University to advance the broader community improvement/neighborhood revitalization agenda for the Greater Coppin Heights/Rosemont Community. In 2014 the CHCDC became an independent organization.
